The Traditional Leaving Cert

Warning

• Although it is hoped that all subjects will be offered, if there are insufficient numbers or not enough resources from the DES, this could mean that a subject may not run next year.

The Process

Step1

Students will select 6 subjects in order of preference from 1-6 (1-4 being their preference for September with two back-ups)
It is therefore of vital importance that students do their research and put time and effort into making these choices.

Step 2

This data is inputted into a computer program which will decide on the subject groupings for next year

Note:

Where a student is not successful in being allocated their top 4 subjects, we will discuss the options on an individual basis

Group 1:Sp/Bio/Chem/DCG/Bus/Comp Sc/PE

Group 2:Fr/Geog/Hist/Bio/Acc/Econ/Ag Sci

Group 3: Art/Phy/Bio/Mus/Eng/PE/Geog

Group 4:Ger/Sp/Geog/Chem/HE/Const/Bio

French/ German / Spanish

- A modern language (French/ German / Spanish) is essential to gain entry to a number of courses in the NUI Colleges (UCD, UCC, UG, RCSI, Maynooth University) eg: Arts, Commerce, Law, Psychology, Medicine, Veterinary, Dentistry, Allied healthcare courses (OT, SLT, Physio etc)
- This represents approximately 11% of all courses available through the CAO
- A 3rd language is also a requirement for a Cadetship in the Army, Navy or Air Corps

What can I do without a modern language?

A Modern language is **NOT** required to study:

- Nursing, Engineering, Agriculture and Science at the NUI Colleges
- **✓ Business & Law courses at Maynooth University**
- In DCU, Trinity College Dublin, University of Limerick (unless it is specifically required for a language course)
- **✓ In the Technological Universities (eg ATU, TUS etc)**
- **✓ In the Institutes of Technology (eg DkIT)**
- ✓ Non-language courses in the UK including Northern Ireland

NUI Exemption


- Any student born outside of the Republic of Ireland may apply for an exemption from Irish for entry to any of the NUI colleges (UG, UCD, UCC, Maynooth University, RCSI)
- As they will still be doing Irish for the LC, they may present Irish then as their Modern Language for NUI colleges
- This means that these students could make the decision not to do a language for the L.C., and instead pick a subject that they prefer or could potentially perform better in
- This exemption also applies to students with a Specific Learning Disability(e.g. Dyslexia) who can receive an exemption from Irish and the foreign language

A Science Subject What 3rd level courses require a Science Subject?

- Science/Science related courses
- Engineering at Universities
- Medicine
- Dentistry/ Dental Nursing
- Veterinary/Vet. Nursing
- Pharmacy/Pharmacy Technician
- Physiotherapy
- Radiography
- Nursing
- Food Science
- Geography & Geoscience (TCD)

- Occupational Therapy
- Speech Therapy (not in UU)
- Podiatry
- Sports Science
- Med. Lab. Science
- Dietetics/ Human Nutrition
- Optometry
- Paramedic Studies
- I.T. courses (some)
- Financial Maths & Economics (UG)
- These are all CAO courses, UK courses may differ

Two Science Subjects?:

- Important/Useful for careers in Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy (but not essential)
- ESSENTIAL IN THE FOLLOWING COURSES:
- Medicine @TCD and @UCC*
- Dentistry @TCD and @UCC*
- Physiotherapy@TCD
- Human Health & Disease @ TCD
- Pharmacy@UCC
- UK colleges including UU and QUB require 2 science subjects for some courses eg Medicine, Dentistry, Physiotherapy, Pharmacy, Optometry and many more....in some cases Higher level Maths is accepted as a science alternative in UK
- Note: Agricultural Science is not always accepted for entry to UK courses
- RESEARCH IS VERY IMPORTANT
